## The 1934 Season

### BAYLOR

With an otherwise dismal season brightened by a sensational 13 to 6 victory over Ray Morrison's Southern Methodist Mustangs, Baylor university's fighting Bruins will take the field this afternoon hoping to turn the trick that they have done twice before, defeat Rice, and present Texas University with a conference championship.

Back in 1928 S. M. U. came to Waco with a fine ball club which was heading for the championship throne, but an inferior Baylor team arose and smote the Ponies down 2 to 0, handing the crown to the Texas Longhorns. Again in 1930 the State University was declared champions when the Bears whipped the leading T. C. U. Frogs 35 to 14. Sports fans and critics are wondering this afternoon therefore whether or not another Baylor squad will come through with an opportune victory and give Jack Chevigny a championship in his first year.

The Bruin record this season does not indicate that the fans may look for any such occurrence. With the exception of the Mustang fray last week, the Green and Gold have been very unimpressive while losing six major contests, including games to Texas Tech, Arkansas, Texas Aggies, Texas Christian, Texas, and Centenary. Then it must also be remembered that the team that beat S. M. U. was an inspired aggregation that was fighting to uphold the tradition, which says that no Pony squad has ever walked off a Waco gridiron the victor in a football game.

Several Bruins will be playing their last game of their careers against Rice today. Joe Jack Pearce, captain, whose superb passing and all-around playing have been instrumental in many Baylor victories; Warren "Red" Weathers, sub-captain, hard fighting tackle; Pennie Frisby, plunging fullback who is one of the most consistent and valuable men on the squad; and Rudy Hall, Zimmerman, and Price will wind up their college careers.

### RICE

Coach Jimmy Kitts has brought to Waco today the most powerful team in the history of the Houston school. His magnificent record, which was unblemished by defeat and marred only by a 9 to 9 draw with Louisiana State until last week's upset by Texas Christian, has been made while playing one of the toughest and longest schedules any Southwest conference school has ever attempted.

Opening the season against Loyola of the South at New Orleans, the Owls waded through to a 12 to 0 win and the first of a long series of successes. The next week the Feathered tribe were hosts to Louisiana State, and were leading Biff Jones' crew 9 to 0 in the fourth quarter and apparently had the game sewed up, when Abe Mickal got loose for a touchdown, which tied up the game as the Owls had presented the Tigers with an intentional safety and kicked out of danger.

From then on until last week Kitt's crew was flying along on all cylinders and had moved to sixth place in the national ranking at the time of its defeat. Left in the dust of the Rice steamroller were Purdue, defeated in Lafayette 14 to 0, Southern Methodist, Arkansas, Creighton, Texas A. & I., Texas Aggies, and Texas.

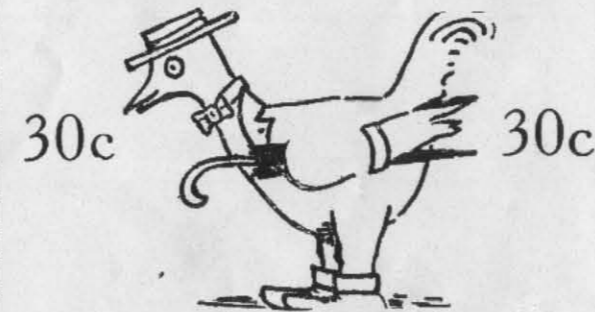
Featured in the Owls' attack against Baylor and the conference championship this afternoon will be the touchdown twins, Bill Wallace and John McCauley; Bale, a guard; Mays, tackle; Arthur, center and captain; and Sylvester, an all-conference end. Witt, giant fullback, while not so spectacular as his backfield mates is just as valuable with his great blocking, line plunging, and defensive ability.

While Kitts and his Owls deserve the great record they have compiled, at the same time they have been fortunate in not having any injuries of the kind which have continually hampered the work of such conference stars as Hilliard and Robert Wilson.

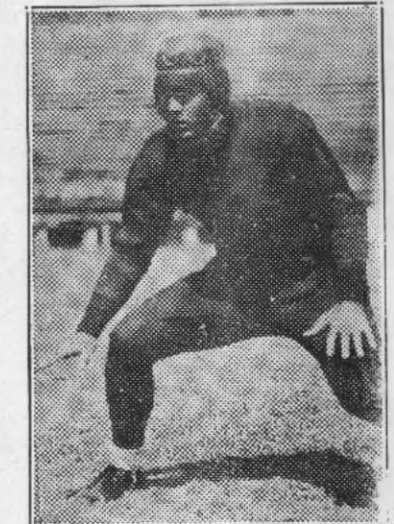
