Information on T.C.U.

The Horned Frogs won their first Southwest Conference football championship in 1929 and repeated in 1932. In 1930 they finished in third place, in 1931 in second place, in 1933 in a tie for second, in 1934 in fourth, in 1935, 1936 and 1937 in second place. The 1935 team defeated L. S. U. 3 to 2 in the annual Sugar Bowl game in New Orleans and was given first place in the Williamson football ratings. In 1936, by virtue of victories over Santa Clara (Sugar Bowl champions) and Marquette University in the Cotton Bowl (Dallas, 16 to 6), the Frogs were rated the fifth team in the nation.

HEAD COACH LEO R. ("DUTCH") MEYER

It is just 21 years since Leo R. Meyer came to Texas Christian University—as a freshman from Waco, Texas. As a youngster, Meyer lived just across the street from T. C. U., when the institution was located in Waco. As the young mascot and water-boy for the Frogs he cherished an ambition to be one of the varsity athletes some day—and to play against Baylor.

The freshman of 1917 became one of T. C. U.'s most versatile athletes. Meyer lettered four times in basketball at guard (freshmen were eligible for varsity competition in those days); four times in baseball as pitcher; and twice in football at end. He captained the cage team twice and the baseball nine once. Ten varsity letters and three times captain—not a bad collegiate record!

Coach Meyer, along with his coach and most of the other athletes, took time out in 1918 for army service in the World War. Meyer trained at Fort Sheridan and was commissioned a second lieutenant. He was stationed at Transylvania College, Lexington, Ky., to train the S. A. T. C. The armistice caught him there and he was discharged in December, 1918.

When Coach Meyer graduated in 1922 he had such an impressive record in baseball that the Cleveland Indians signed him. But an old shoulder injury bothered him so much that he headed back to Texas. In the winter and spring of 1922 he coached at Poly High in Fort Worth. In the fall of 1923, with T. C. U.'s entry into the Southwest Conference, he came back to the school as freshman coach. And he has been here every since.

During his 11 years as freshman football coach, Meyer played 33 games and won all but four. As varsity baseball coach during the same time he

always had his teams in the thick of the conference fight, winning the diamond championship in 1933.

In his four years as head football coach (1934-37, inclusive), Meyer has won 33 games, lost 11 and tied 4, for a percentage of .729. In non-conference competition, the Meyer-coached elevens have won 18, lost 5 and tied 1, for a percentage of .771. In conference play, the Horned Frogs have taken 15, dropped 6 and tied 3, for a .667 figure. Coach Meyer took his team to the Sugar Bowl Jan. 1, 1936, to win from L. S. U. 3 to 2; and to the Cotton Bowl Jan. 1, 1937, to win from Marquette 16 to 6.

I. B. HALE—Tackle

"Ibey" was a full-fledged all-American and all-conference last year and was rated tops for the season by most of his opponents. Line Coach Mike Brumbelow says, "Hale does everything right." He is faster than many a player under 200. Hale rates high in the list of all-time Frog greats.

KI ALDRICH—Center

Ki is one of the nation's outstanding pivot men. Against Fordham last year he outplayed the great "Woji," according to most New York sports writers. He likes the game in the rocking, socking manner and always gives his all. He was unanimous choice for all-conference honors last year and made several all-American choices.

DON LOONEY—End

Looney has been the answer to a coach's prayer for an end. He jumped in and earned a starting berth as a soph last year, and it looks as though he might hold that spot until he plays out his string. Because of his good nature, he comes in for much ribbing, but don't ever think he can't play football!

DAVID O'BRIEN—Quarterback

Last season Davey handled the ball on more than half the Frog plays, either passing, running or kicking. Grantland Rice, after seeing him in two games, exclaimed: "The boy must be stuffed with scrap iron." He received all-Southwest honors last year and considerable all-American mention. As the boy who made the fans forget Sam Baugh, Davey is one important cog in the T. C. U. machine!
