Otis Douglas, 39-year old native Virginian and the 20th man to direct Razorback football fortunes since 1894, comes to Arkansas from the pro world champion Philadelphia Eagles.

The new Porker field general, a veteran of the game as a player, trainer and coach, succeeds John H. Barnhill who vacated the position while retaining his directorship at the close of the 1949 season.

Douglas, highly recommended by all those who he has worked with thus assumes his first head coaching job at a major college. On the other hand, the 247-pound Otis is a veteran of the game and was recognized by his former boss, Earl "Greasy" Neale, as a most important man in the Eagle set-up.

Arkansas' new football mentor is a graduate of the College of William & Mary, 1933, where he received his BS. He later received his master's degree from the University of Michigan. While at William & Mary, the versatile Douglas played four years of football, captaining his senior team. In addition he found time to become the college's best and only undefeated wrestler and was even considered for the '32 Olympic squad in the heavyweight class until a case of measles cut him out of the picture.

After graduation, Otis stayed at his alma mater to teach physical education, direct the intramural program, assist coaching football, coach track and swimming, and in addition was the trainer and head football scout. He was even in charge of the football movies. He augmented his income by playing football in the Dixie League and boxing professionally.

In the latter year he moved to Akron University. There he assisted with football, taught physical education, coached the gym teams and acted as trainer. In the busy winter-time he coached swimming (he's an authority on this sport), freshman basketball and wrestling; and when spring broke, track and spring football. Apparently the trustees figured this "superman" had too much idle time on his hands, for they soon added the duties of Athletic Director. Had it not been for the fact that Douglas owned his own plane and was a licensed pilot he might have been able to scout Akron's opponents.

Otis was commissioned a Lieutenant in the Navy during World War II and worked with Maryland's Jim Tatum as coach at Jacksonville Naval Air Station (Fla.). Just a youngster at 31, Douglas was also first string tackle with the team.

He decided after the war to go right on playing and his former line coach at William & Mary, John Kellison, who was then with the Eagles, offered him a contract. Last season, at the tender age of 38, Douglas was the oldest active player in the National Football league.

He took on the duties of head coach at Drexel Tech while playing with the Eagles in 1948, and last year gave them their first winning season in almost a decade.

. In the 1949 College All Star game, Douglas was asked to train the Eagles in the split-T formation, the same offense Bud Wilkinson was expected to use against them. Douglas and the Eagles wrapped the college boys, 38-0, the worst licking of the series.
