Just two years after that opening date the first football contest with Baylor University initiated the series which becomes one game longer today. The series has been typical of Southwest Conference football. The underdog always intends to win and occasionally does. May this game continue the good spirit of friendly rivalry which has become so well established.

TODAY'S GAME

Today, Baylor and Rice close their 1952 football seasons in a game that is expected to be much closer than the games between these old rivals the past two seasons.

Up-and-coming Rice has won its last three starts after a slow getaway. In defeating Arkansas, Texas A&M and TCU, the Owls have earned the title of one of the league's most improved football teams.

They boast a rugged defense, outstanding linebacker in Don Rhoden and a very dangerious aerial game. Leroy Fenstemaker and Atchley Proctor, each of whom directed a touchdown drive against TCU, will operate the Owls' T-attack.

Baylor bounced back with an impressive showing against SMU last week, holding the favored Mustangs to a 7-7 deadlock and outplaying the Ponies in most departments.

So today's game should be a hotly-contested battle all the way. It looks like a toss-up.

Over the years, Baylor has won 16 times from Rice. The Owls have scored 14 victories over the Bruins, and two games ended in ties. The series started back in 1914 when Rice won a 14-13 thriller. Baylor won the following year, 26-0.

Today's game is the last in Baylor football uniforms for twelve seniors. Bruins playing their final college game today are halfbacks Don Carpenter and Glen Jones, fullbacks Richard Parma and Frank Bouldin, guards Bill Athey, Pete Erben and Johnny Davis, end Jim Speer, center Jack Sisco, linebackers C. O. Brocato and Starkey Davis. Offensive tackle Ed Moak, another senior, will not suit out because of a dislocated shoulder. The all-time Rice-Baylor series:
